Stakeholders Feedback Collection, Analysis and Action Taken Report of 2018-19

Collection of Feedback

Feedback on curriculum and related aspects has been collected on line at www.gcrjy.ac.in/iqac. Feedbacks have been designed separately for students, teachers, parents, alumni, industrial experts. Access to this tab is given 24/7 and analysis is made twice that is before the departments go for conduct of Board of Studies.

In the month of November, 2018 and March, 2019 the feedbacks were analysed by IQAC with the assistance of Department of Statistics. Major suggestions from stakeholders were forwarded to concerned Departments for Action.

During the Academic year 2018 – 19, 3472 (84 per cent) students from 39 UG programmes and 9 PG programmes gave their feedback on curriculum and academic environment and other student related services on campus. Due care has been taken to collect feedback from Students studying in all programmes.

1. Student feedback Analysis:

Questionnaire for students is structured with five questions on curriculum, six questions on Academic Environment and six questions on other related services. The questions in all these cases are to be answered on 5 rating scale beginning poor to excellent and one open question for suggestions.

Curriculum based Question:

Q1. Relevance of Course structure to the course objective.

86 per cent of the students rated excellent, very good and good . **Q2. Scope of skill development/ employability/Entrepreneurship in the courses offered.** 83 per cent of the students rated excellent, very good and good.

Q3. The research orientation in the course design

82 per cent students rated excellent, very good and good.

Q4. Structure of CBCS curriculum

82 per cent students rated excellent, very good and good.

Q5. Pattern of curriculum evaluation.

83 per cent students rated excellent, very good and good.

Academic Environment

Q1. Rate the academic environment of the college

83 per cent of students rated the academic environment of the college excellent, very good and good.

Q2. Teaching Methodology adopted

84 per cent of students rated Teaching Methodology as excellent, very good and good.

Q3. Coverage of Syllabi

83 per cent of the students rated the coverage of syllabi as excellent, very good and good.

Q4. Adherence to academic calendar

98 per cent of the students rated the adherence to academic calendar as excellent, very good and good.

Q5. Library facilities

83 per cent of the students rated the library facilities as excellent and very good.

Q6. Lab Facilities

70 per cent of the students rated the adherence to academic calendar as excellent and very good.

86 per cent of the students agreed on awareness of on campus and off campus drives.

2. Parent Feedback

This questionnaire is structured with four questions. All the four questions are to be answered either yes or no with suggestions. (347+349=696) Numbers of parents have given their feedback on line during the academic year 2018-19.

Q1. Is the course structure satisfactory?

99 per cent of the parents expressed their satisfaction over the course structure of the programme in which their ward is admitted.

Q2. Does the curriculum design meet the employment needs?

98 per cent of the parents expressed their view that the curriculum design met the employment needs in general.

Q3. Does the curriculum ensure all round development of ward?

99 per cent of the parents agreed that the curriculum contributed to the overall development of ward.

3. Teacher's Feedback:

67 per cent strongly agreed and 33 per cent agreed that course structure is in line with Programme Outcomes in general and Programme Specific Outcomes in particular.

67 per cent strongly agreed and 33 per cent agreed that course content is relevant to course outcomes.

Q3. The course content matches the needs of all levels of learners.

63 per cent strongly agreed and 37 per cent agreed that course content matched the needs of all levels of learners,

Q4. It is comfortable to adopt new pedagogical teaching techniques in the stipulated time period as planned for curriculum transaction.

87 per cent strongly agreed and 12 per cent agreed that it was comfortable to adopt new pedagogical teaching techniques in the stipulated time period as planned for curriculum transaction.

Q5. The college facilitates ICT based teaching

67 per cent strongly agreed and 33 per cent agreed that the college facilitated ICT based teaching.

Q6. Internal Assessment is beneficial and enhances learning level of students

65 per cent strongly agreed and 35 per cent agreed that the internal assessment was beneficial in enhancing learning levels of students.

Q7. Evaluation of semester end examination is fair and the variation with internal assessment is well within the acceptable limits.

67 per cent of teachers strongly agreed and 33 per cent agreed that the SEE evaluation was fair and variation of SEE with that of Internal Assessment was well in acceptable limits.

4. Alumni Feedback

This questionnaire is structured with 5 questions and one open end question for suggestions. The feedback is designed in a simple manner to elicit the opinion of Alumni with respect to the curriculum they have studied in the institution with yes / no answers and suggestions against each question.

Q1. The prescribed curriculum design helped you to gain knowledge

100 per cent of the Alumni expressed their consent over the question that the curriculum design helped to gain knowledge.

Q2. Is the course structure relevant to progress for higher levels of education

95 per cent of alumni felt that the curriculum structure helped them to progress for higher levels of education.

Q3. Is the course design applicable to real life situation.

94 per cent of the alumni responded that the courses design are well applicable to real life situation.

Q4. Did the course structure evoke research aptitude?

95 per cent of the alumni felt that the course structure designed and adopted evoked research aptitude.

Q5. Is the course structure helpful for you to adapt yourself to your career?

93 per cent of the alumni felt that the course structure was helpful for them to adapt to their career.

5. Industrial Feedback Analysis:

This questionnaire is structured with 5 questions and one open end question for suggestions. The feedback is designed in a simple manner to elicit the observations of the industrialists as to Satisfactory and needs to improve.

Seven industrialists gave their feedback during the academic year 2018-19.

Q1. Technical skills for employability

100 per cent industrialists expressed their satisfaction over the employability of technical skills among the students.

Q.2. Sufficiency of theoretical Background and practical applications

86 per cent industrialists expressed their satisfaction over the sufficiency of theoretical background and practical application while 14 per cent recommended measures to improve on the same.

Q3. Creative and Innovative

71 per cent of the industrialists expressed their satisfaction over the creativity and innovative attitude of the students and 29 per cent of them expressed the need to take measure by the institution in this direction.

Q4. Relevance of the Course Content

Cent per cent of the industrialists expressed their satisfaction over the Relevance of the course content to the needs of the industry.

Q5. Soft Skills and Communication Skills

71 per cent of the industrialists expressed their satisfaction over the Soft and communication skills of the students and 29 per cent of them felt that there is a need to further improve the soft and communication skill among the students.
