

## Examinations, Evaluation & Results

The College was granted autonomous status by the UGC from the academic year 2000-2001. Under the Autonomous set up, the college introduced Semester system. The Syllabus for each semester and the examination pattern are setup with the help of Board of Studies for each subject. The Examination Cell of the College is a confidential wing consisting of Controller of Examinations and Assistant Controllers of Examination. The Examination Cell is a fully computerized, fool proof environment which conducts the examinations in a confidential and transparent manner and makes the evaluation process in a highly confidential and professional environment.

### Evaluation Process:

1. In every semester, the award of internal assessment marks is non-institutional and the concerned HOD is responsible to conduct-/submit the CIA to the Examination Cell.

2. There is no minimum marks for internal assessment (CIA) for 2016-17 admitted batch. However, from the 2019-20 admitted batch, the minimum marks in CIA is 35%
3. 40% is the minimum pass marks in internal and Semester End Exams together and must secure 35% in Semester End Exams.
4. There is no provision to conduct internal examinations again. Students shall compulsory pass in otherwise, they have to secure the total 40% marks in SEE only, even though they secured 35% marks in SEE independently.
5. Project works in 6<sup>th</sup> semester.
6. Internal practical examinations are conducted in 1,3,5 semesters and external practical examinations are conducted in 2,4,6 semesters (2016-17 admitted batch onwards)

In final Semester under the Cluster system, the student has to select one elective each under Paper-VII and also to choose one cluster (consisting of three papers VIII to X) among the clusters offered by the department.

The final year students are also compulsorily to undergo skill training under the JKC platform (Finishing School Training) that provide skills necessary for securing an employment.

Besides 120 credits for actual curriculum, extra credits are awarded to the students who take part in various Co-curricular and extra-curricular activities such as NCC, NSS, Sports & Games, Cultural and Literary events, Project work and Community Social work. Extra credits are also awarded for attendance.

### **CREDITS:**

In B.A. and B.Com. programmes, there are 134 credits and B.Sc. there are 158 credits. The performance of each student is assessed for languages, foundation courses and subjects. In B.Sc. programme, each optional in each module will be awarded 3 credits each and 2 credits each for each practical optional subject. In B.A and B.Com. programmes, each core optional subject carries 4 credits.

### **Results**

Results are normally announced within three weeks after the completion of last examination. The results are announced online and the candidates can check them by visiting the college website. Marks lists are prepared and distributed to the students through the proctors.

## **Instant Examinations:**

Facility to appear for Instant examinations is available only for the Final year regular students having not more than 2 backlog papers across all the semesters.

1. In every semester, the award of internal assessment marks is non-institutional and the concerned HOD is responsible to conduct-/submit the CIA to the Examination Cell.
2. There is no minimum marks for internal assessment (CIA) .
3. 40% is the minimum pass marks in internal and Semester End Exams together and must secure 35% in Semester End Exams.
4. There is no provision to conduct internal examinations again. Students shall compulsory pass in otherwise, they have to secure the total 40% marks in SEE only, even though they secured 35% marks in SEE independently.
5. For every semester practical examinations are conducted by external examiners.
6. Two times valuations (by Internal Examiners as well as External Examiners), and the average of both these valuations is considered for final award of marks.

7. if the variation between internal and external evaluation is more than 20% then it will go for third valuation and the average of nearest two valuations is considered for final award of marks.

8. There is no provision for revaluation for PG Exams

### **Credits:**

For every course, 4 credits are allotted for theory and 2 credits for practicals. Besides credits for actual curriculum, extra credits are awarded to the students who take part in various Co-curricular, extra-curricular and extension activities such as NCC, NSS, Sports & Games, Cultural and Literary events, Project work and Community Social work. Extra credits are also awarded for attendance.
