- The world's population in 2024 is projected to be 8,161,972,572, according to World meter. This is a 0.87% increase from the previous year.
- The United Nations publishes the World Population Prospects report, which includes population projections.

According to the latest UN data, the global population in 2024 is estimated to be around 8.2 billion people. Notably, India is projected to be the most populated country with a population of approximately 1.45 billion, followed by China with around 1.42 billion.

- Some countries are experiencing population growth, while others are seeing population decline.
- India is the most populated country in the world, with an estimated population of 144.17 crore.
- India's population is expected to double in 77 years.
- 68% of India's population is between the ages of 15 and 64.
- India's total fertility rate is estimated at 2.0.
- Life expectancy at birth in India is estimated at 71 years for men and 74 years for women.

EVIDENCE OF SUCCESS (IN ABOUT 200 WORDS)

The **2024 Revision of World Population Prospects** is the twenty-eighth edition of official United Nations population estimates and projections that have been prepared by the Population Division of the Department of Economic and Social Affairs of the United Nations Secretariat. It presents population estimates from 1950 to the present for 237 countries or areas, underpinned by analyses of historical demographic trends. This latest assessment considers the results of 1,910 national population censuses conducted between 1950 and 2023, as well as information from vital registration systems and from 3,189 nationally representative sample surveys. The **2024 revision** also presents population projections to the year 2100 that reflect a range of plausible outcomes at the global, regional and national levels.

PROBLEMS ENCOUNTERED (IN ABOUT 150 WORDS)

As of 2024, major population-related problems include a rapidly aging population in many developed countries, leading to declining workforce sizes, increased pressure on social security systems, and potential economic slowdowns; while in developing nations, high population growth can strain access to basic necessities like food, water, healthcare, and education, further exacerbating poverty and environmental issues; with significant concerns about resource depletion and climate change due to increased consumption from a growing population.
