1. **Approval for Conduct:**

#### Procedure for Drafting Resolutions:

- Students will conduct research and prepare draft Bills with the help of faculty.
- Each Bill will be presented, debated, and modified based on parliamentary discussion.
- Voting will be conducted following democratic procedures to pass or reject each Resolution.

#### 5. Outcome:

- A final report documenting all Bills discussed and Resolutions passed will be submitted to the Principal's Office and archived by the Department of Political Science.

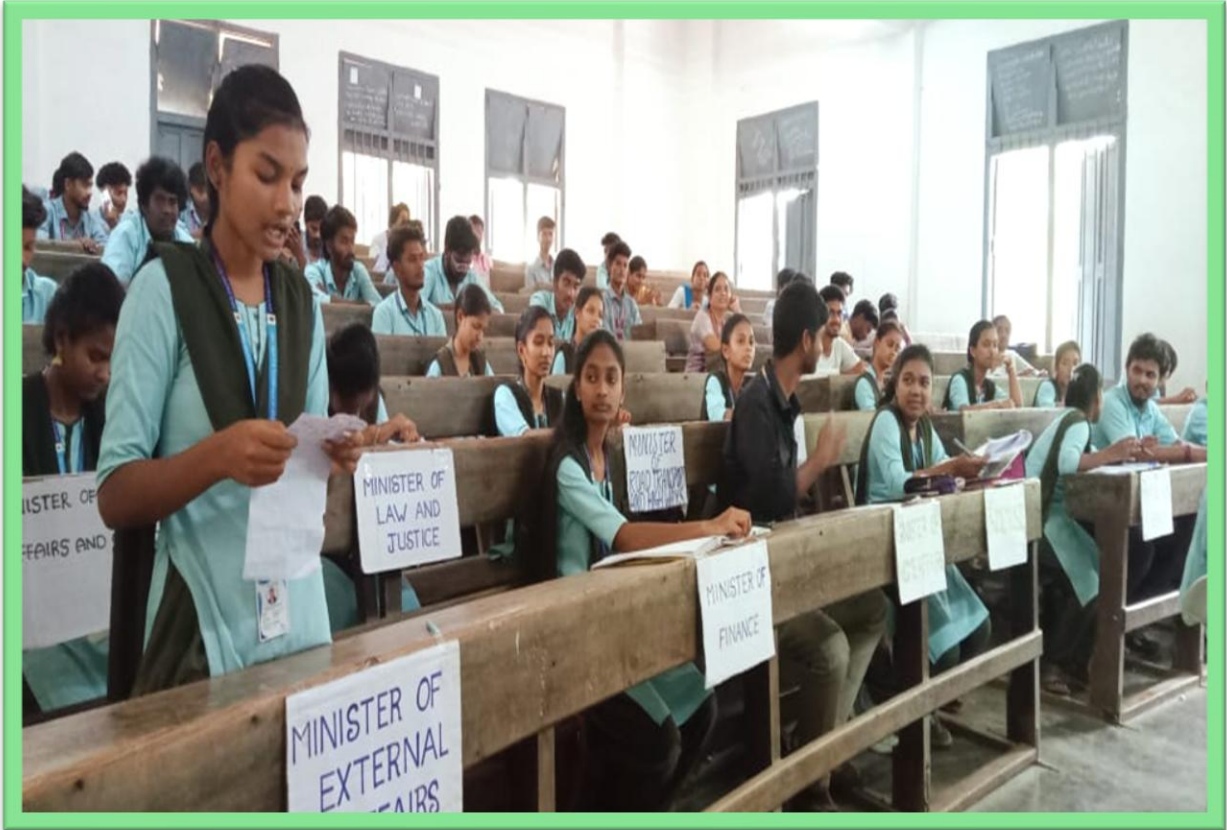
