Workshop on "Future Ready with Artificial Intelligence"

Theme: "Learn, Build & Lead with AI"

1. INTRODUCTION

On 10 July 2026, a comprehensive workshop titled "**Future Ready with Artificial Intelligence**" was organized to equip students with essential technological skills. The event was highly successful, drawing a total of 120 participating students from the departments of Philosophy, Political Science, Social Work, and Journalism & Mass Communication.

The program commenced with a welcoming address by Gargi Unnikrishnan, Lecturer in Social Work, who formally introduced the guest speaker to the gathering.

2. ADDRESS BY HOD, DEPARTMENT OF SOCIAL WORK

Dr. K. Sita Mahalakshmi, Head of the Department of Social Work, addressed the participants and took an active role in the interactive session. Highlighting the complexity and breadth of modern technology, she emphasized to the students that AI is not just a single application but rather a multifaceted "family" of tools and systems. Her insights helped bridge the gap between traditional social sciences and the evolving digital landscape, encouraging students to embrace these technologies. She also expressed her gratitude to Tatavarthi Gurukulam as it has come forward to organise the workshop as part of MoU with them.

3. KEY NOTE SPEAKER

The session was expertly guided by **Mr. Kalyan Tatavarthy**, an AI Leader based in Melbourne, Australia. Mr. Tatavarthy serves as the Co-founder of both Yairra AI Solutions and CyALnix Pty Ltd.

4. SESSION HIGHLIGHTS AND PRESENTATION

Mr. Tatavarthy delivered an engaging presentation structured as a "five-stop journey," concluding with a live demonstration. The core topics covered included:

What AI Really Is: He helped students cut through common "movie myths" regarding artificial intelligence. He detailed the technological leap from older AI, which merely "judged" and sorted

existing data (such as spam filters or X-ray analysis), to modern Generative AI, which actively "makes" and creates new essays, pictures, and voices.

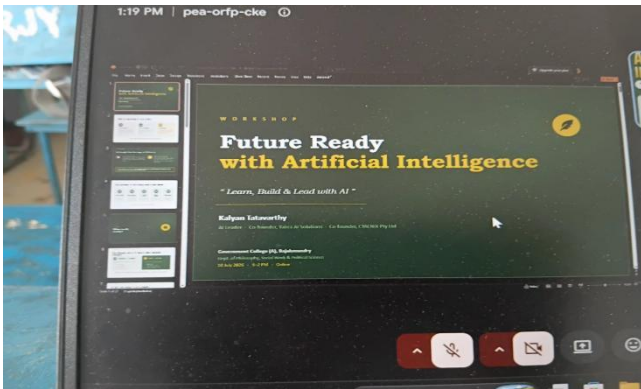
The AI Toolbox: The speaker explored various AI tools and their practical uses, demonstrating that the technology extends far beyond standard platforms like ChatGPT.

AI for YOUR World: He contextualized artificial intelligence specifically for the attendees' fields, discussing its impact on Philosophy, Social Work, and Politics.

Skills Needed for the AI Era & Careers: Mr. Tatavarthy provided insights into how students can identify where they fit in the evolving job market and the specific skills required to "win" in an AI-driven future.
