Health and Safety Measures

Given the ongoing health and safety concerns, strict protocols were followed throughout the event. All donors were screened for eligibility, and social distancing measures were maintained. Each donor was provided with a brief health check-up to ensure they were fit to donate. Face masks and sanitizers were made available for all participants.

Impact and Outcome

The camp was a resounding success, both in terms of participation and the volume of blood collected. The donated blood units were handed over to the Government blood bank to assist patients in need, supporting critical cases such as accident victims, surgical patients, and individuals with chronic blood disorders. This event not only met its goals but also left a positive impact on the student body, instilling a sense of social responsibility and compassion.
